I am in receipt of your letter of April 16, 2010 notifying me you have closed my account. However, the \$80.36 is in dispute due to the fraudulent manner in which the overdraft was created.

Dear Ms. Lopez:

This is to inform you the El Paso County Child Support Enforcement Unit (CSEU), a non-government entity, contacted your bank on March 11, 2010 and fraudulently issued the bank levy notice you copied to me with your letter of March 12, 2010 under the authority of the Colorado Division of Child Support Enforcement.

Please be advised the attached final order identified by CSEU as having been entered on January 13, 2010, was actually entered March 26, 2010 and back-dated using the *nunc pro tunc* rule to the date of the hearing

on January 13, 2010. The March 11, 2010 arrears balance on the levy notice coincides with the date CSEU's legal representative stopped responding to filings on the child support modification action. This was 15 days prior to the entry of the corrupt final order.

Please be advised I contacted the Colorado Division of Banking and the Western District Office of the OCC by letter on April 6, 2010 to alert them as well. You may contact Director of Examinations Mary Stanfield with the Division of Banking and/or Deputy Controller Kay Kowitt with the OCC for verification purposes.

As this matter is under investigation, I would advise you to refrain from reporting the alleged indebtedness to any collection agency or credit bureau.
