RE: Intake Denied by Denver Police Department

Dear District Attorney Morrissey:

Please find enclosed a copy of the police statement packet (court transcript excluded) that was presented by me to Denver Police Officer Huff on Friday, April 29, 2011.

Officer Huff listened to a brief overview of my complaint and did a cursory review of the written statement before directing me to the Colorado Department of Human Services five blocks away. His comments clearly indicated he understood the gravity of what was reported to him.

At the CDHS, I was permitted to call the Child Support Enforcement Division upstairs to explain my reason for being there. Soon, "Violetta" was sent down to the lobby to receive the packet for delivery to Leslie McGrew. I reluctantly handed the packet off to her, including a purchased copy of the court transcript, knowing that Ms. McGrew is also named in the police statement. I am certain that you (or anyone else) can understand why handing a criminal complaint for prosecution to a suspect of the complaint provides no assurance to me that justice will be done.

I have also enclosed a copy of the Colorado Springs Police Department packet, excluding exhibits, that was presented to El Paso County District Attorney Dan May following Deputy District Attorney Burney's decision not to pursue criminal charges for separate but related violations of Colorado's perjury laws. I believe the enclosed communications between me and the El Paso District Attorney's Office and the enclosed notice to Attorney General Suthers and the CDHS do a good job of exposing why state law enforcement officials refuse to create a public record of these incidents or take in the complaints for prosecution consideration through normal channels.

Since Ms. McGrew is so personally involved in the handling of the case at the CDHS, I handed off a copy of the CSPD packet, excluding exhibits, to Violetta as well. Unlike the way I have been treated, I have given every local, state, and federal official complete access to the truth.

I respectfully ask that the Denver District Attorney's Office conduct an independent investigation of the complaint. I am confident the State's cover-up of the fraudulent child support enforcement case and the corrupt prosecution of it in the El Paso County District Court will become apparent.
